### Transfer Process

The transfer process began on April 1st. If you are interested in moving to a different work location in the same position (same job title) that you currently hold, you have until April 15th to submit an application for transfer, if you are interested in perhaps moving to a different work location in the same position (same job title) that you currently hold. It is important to note that, once you have indicated a choice on the transfer form, should that choice become available, you will be expected to move to that position in September. You will have no right to refuse the placement. Transfers can only be made between positions that are not vacant.

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### "Work for the Living, Remember the Dead"

April 28th is Canada's National Day of Mourning for workers killed or injured on the job. This day offers employers and workers an opportunity not only to remember, but also to publicly renew their commitment to health and safety in the workplace.

Where and when did this day of observance originate? The first Day of Mourning was initiated by the Canadian Union of Public Employees as Workers' Memorial Day in 1984. The next year the Canadian Labour Congress declared it a national day, which then became law in 1990 with the Official Mourning Day's Act.

Why April 28? The Workers Compensation Act was passed on April 28, 1911.

This year, our members will be taking part in a Health and Safety PD on April 27, the day prior to the Day of Mourning. The employer has agreed to pause for a Moment of Silence during this training in order that we may honour those workers whose lives have been lost or affected by workplace injuries. We ask that everyone wear something black that day to show our united commitment to health and safety.
