Our Local 4186 Strategic Plan for Bargaining was discussed at a Special Meeting on January 19, 2019. Our provincial body, the Ontario School Board Council of Unions, is encouraging all school board locals to prepare for bargaining. They are anticipating a difficult round of bargaining with the Ford government – facing cutbacks and concessions, along with zeros for wage increases.

Your Bargaining Committee has been meeting and working on local proposals. Even more important than the language we take to the bargaining table, however, is the support we receive from our members. As CUPE school board workers, we must become actively engaged in the process of mobilizing for a successful bargaining campaign. We must show the government and the employers that we stand behind our bargaining committees and the goals we want to achieve.

learn about bargaining and mobilization; start saving and preparing for potential job action this fall.

Inclement Weather What to Do

If your home school is closed, contact your Principal/Supervisor and report to the nearest school you can safely access. The priority is to attend elementary schools, unless a secondary school is truly the nearest school. If you are Custodial or Maintenance staff, you will receive assignment direction from Building Services.

If buses are cancelled, members are to report to their home school if they can safely do so.

If your home school is open and you have contacted the principal stating you cannot make it safely to school, you are to report to the nearest school you can safely access. The priority is to attend elementary schools, unless a secondary school is truly the nearest school. Staff should prepare in advance to ensure that they are leaving sufficient time to travel and arrive safely. Those who are waiting for their road to be plowed are expected to travel when it is safe to do so.

Bill 115 Remedy Payment and Taxation

The CUPE Remedy Payment (paid out February, 2018) is considered non-taxable damages and is excluded from income on your 2018 tax return. There are no reporting requirements and it should not be included on the T4 form.


